4-H COUNTY AMBASSADOR NEWS





The California 4-H County Ambassador Program is a leadership development opportunity for older youth. It is delivered at the county level. County Ambassadors are the champions of the 4-H Program in their county, while they are developing their leadership skills. 4-H County Ambassadors are role models for their fellow 4-H members, their county, and their community.

The SLO County 4-H Youth Development Program is currently accepting SLO 4-H County Ambassador Applications. The Applications are due in the 4-H Office by Monday, May 11th at 5:00 p.m.

To be eligible for the 4-H County Ambassador rank, a 4-H member must:

- 1) County Ambassadors must be between 14 18 years old and meet the 4-H membership requirements for the length of the term of service. On the first day of the appointment to County Ambassador, applicant must be at least 14 years old.
- 2) Applicant must have completed at least one year of membership in 4-H prior to the year of application. Membership does not have to be the most recent consecutive year.
- Applicant must have demonstrated leadership experience and skills. To ensure that the position of County Ambassador is open to 4-H members in all program delivery modes (community club, afterschool club, SPIN club, summer camp, etc.), a member must document the following:
 - Mastery of a project as demonstrated by at least 6 hours of instruction, documented by a statement of
 - B. 40 hours of significant leadership roles, either inside or outside of 4-H, with at least 10 hours of leadership contributed to 4-H.
 - C. 30 hours of citizenship and/or community service, either inside or outside of 4-H, with at least 6 hours through 4-H.
 - D. 10 public speaking engagements, at least 2 of which must have been given at a 4-H event.
 - E. Demonstrate involvement in 4-H as evidenced by a list of activities that are a combination of 15 of the following: project skill activities, 4-H events attended, and honors/recognition. Definitions for these three categories are found in the Record Book Manual under the section describing the Personal Development Report (PDR). Completing a PDR is not an application requirement for County Ambassador.

Alternatively, a member may submit documentation of having achieved a Gold Star Rank to satisfy the above 5 requirements. Documentation can be the signed and dated Star Rank chart or other written documentation, that is signed by an adult volunteer other than the parent, that the Gold Star Rank was achieved. Previous Ambassadors who qualify may re-apply.

The 4-H County Ambassador Application is being sent to your 4-H Community Club Leader and is posted on the county website: https://ucanr.edu/sites/slo4-h/Club Forms/

The first opportunity for San Luis Obispo 4-H County Ambassadors is to attend the State Leadership Conference (SLC) at UC Davis. Your Registration cost is paid for by the 4-H Volunteer Management Organization. SLC dated will be announced later and will be at UC Davis. If you can't attend SLC, we still encourage you to apply for the other exciting events SLO County 4-H County Ambassadors will participate in throughout the 4-H Program Year.

SLO County 4-H County Ambassador interviews will be announced shortly after May 11th deadline.

Rules for Construction of Cars:

Each car must pass inspection by the official inspection committee before it will be allowed to compete. In order to race in the competition, the car must adhere to the following rules. If you have any questions about the rules, contact troygood@gmail.com

Must use official Pinewood Derby kit supplied by the club

The car weight shall not exceed 5.0 ounces. The official race scale shall be considered final.

The overall length of the car shall not exceed 7 inches.

The overall width of the car shall not exceed 2 3/4 inches.

The overall height of the car must be not exceed 5 inches.

The car must have 1 3/4" clearance between the wheels.

The car must have 3/8" clearance underneath the body.

The block may be shaped any way that is desired, but the wood provided in the kit must be used.

The wheels supplied with the kit must be used. The wheels may not be cut, drilled, beveled or rounded. You may remove the seam from the wheels.

The axles supplied with the kit must be used. They may be polished or lubricated.

Wheel bearings, washers or bushings are prohibited.

The car must be freewheeling, with no starting devices and must not ride on any type of springs.

No loose material of any kind, such as lead shot, may be used, but details such as the steering wheel, driver, decals, painting, and interior detail are permissible as long as these details do not exceed the maximum length, width, and weight specifications.

In addition to the construction requirements, the following Racing Rules will be enforced:

If, during a race, a car leaves the track without interfering with its opponent, it shall be considered to have ended its heat at that point.

If a car leaves its lane, at his sole discretion, the track chairman may inspect the track and, if a track fault is found which probably caused the initial violation, the track chairman may order the race to be rerun after the track is repaired.

If, during a race, no car reaches the finish line on the track, the car which went the farthest in its lane shall be declared as the heat winner

If, during a race, a car leaves its lane and, in so doing, interferes with another racer, then the car at fault shall be declared to have lost the race heat.

Only one car may be registered by any person in the Pinewood Derby.

Only dry lubricants such as graphite or powdered Teflon "white lube" will be allowed for lubricating the wheels. Lubricants may not foul the track.

Registration Information

A registration fee of \$5 per person is due to your 4-H Club. The fee will cover the cost of one car kit which includes a block of wood, wheels and nails. All other materials are not provided.





fun activities that involve food, arts and crafts, and sewing. They also learn about selecting and preparing foods that support *healthy lifestyle choices*.

What is Fashion Revue?

Fashion Revue, which happens together with Food & Arts Celebration, includes an exciting Fashion Show where 4-H members model garments they made in their Clothing & Textiles or Fashion Revue project group. Prior to the show, garments are judged for construction, and then members are interviewed by the judges and may choose to model their garments for the audience. Participating in Fashion Revue is a great way for members to showcase their work, as well as practice communication skills and build self-esteem!

My plan is to have two jumping courses this time; one for low jump training, and one for tall jump training.




