#### 2020 California Mid-State Fair has been Canceled

The 16<sup>th</sup> District Agricultural Association Board of Directors have announced that the 2020 California Mid-State Fair, scheduled to take place July 22 through August 2, has been canceled. The decision was based on the current restrictions from state and local leaders regarding mass gatherings. After thorough discussion, the Board voted unanimously to cancel the 2020 Fair.

Board president David Baldwin said, "The well-being and health of our community is our top priority. Putting on a safe and fun Fair has always been our goal, and we had remained hopeful that the 2020 Fair could indeed happen. However, the current restrictions have made that impossible. We will miss this year's Fair tremendously, but we are now turning our focus to making sure our 4-H, FFA and Industrial Arts exhibitors are taken care of."

Interim CEO Bojorquez said, "We are deeply saddened that we will not be able to host this year's Fair and the decision was not made lightly. But, it is the right decision in order to protect the health and safety of our patrons. Our Board and staff will continue to focus our efforts to support our youth exhibitors and although we will miss seeing all the smiles, eating all the food, and experiencing all the fun this year, we will be back to celebrate "The Biggest Little Fair...Anywhere" in 2021."

The 2021 California Mid-State Fair is set to run July 21 – August 1 and we will be celebrating our 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary.

#### **Junior Livestock Show and Auction**

The California Mid-State Fair is committed to assisting all of our Junior Livestock exhibitors. To that end, we will be facilitating a "virtual" auction on/about the end of July 2020 and/or the beginning of August 2020. Please communicate with your 4-H and/or FFA leaders about further details.

We will also facilitate some sort of show, depending on where the State is at moving through the Governor's re-opening timeline. The show will either be "live/in-person" or "virtual". Again, please communicate with your 4-H and/or FFA leaders about further details.

\*\* Note from the UCCE San Luis Obispo County 4-H Office Staff: We do not have any further information at this time. As soon as we receive any additional detailed information, we will communicate that information asap to the 4-H Community Club Leaders, 4-H Project Leaders and 4-H Families. \*\*

## ONLINE RECORD BOOK (ORB) sunsetting on 7/1/2020

#### **DECISION TO SUNSET ORB EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020**

Challenges and a rapidly changing technological environment have led UC 4-H to a crossroad. Our options are to either fully rebuild ORB or discontinue its use. Given the costs associated with a complete rebuild of the system, we have made the decision to sunset ORB on July 1, 2020.

Those who are currently using ORB for the 2019-20 program year will have access through December 31, 2020 to complete their record book.

#### **NEXT STEPS FOR ORB USERS**

- 1. If you have completed your record book in previous years, download and save copies of them to your computer before June 30, 2020. Instructions for how to do this can be found at http://ucanr.edu/sunsetorb2020
- 2. Use the paper forms to complete your record book beginning in the 2020-21 program year, which will be available by August 2020. These forms are located at http://4h.ucanr.edu/Resources/Member Resources/RecordBook/
- 3. Pass this information on to others that you know are using ORB!

#### 4-H CLUB AND COUNTY LEVEL RECORD BOOK NEWS

#### Important Changes for 2019 – 2020 4-H Record Books as of 5.20.2020

As all of us are trying to navigate this very unusual 4-H year, the State 4-H office has made a few important changes to Record Books as we wind down this year.

I will hit on the highlights – with more information to come once we receive additional guidelines. Most of the clubs will not be having their last meeting of the 4-H year in June but club leaders still need to collect record books so our members can receive any and all credits they have earned.

#### A Change for this 4-H Program Year's books:

There will not be a <u>Collection of Work</u> or the <u>Expression</u> page in this year's record books. The State 4-H office has removed that part on the scoring sheet for the 2019-2020 Record Book judging year. If a member still chooses to add that in their record book that is fine, but there will be no points awarded.

#### Club Level Record Books

<u>Meeting attendance</u>: If your club only had 5 monthly meetings, then that will be your total for the 4-H year and that is what will be used to figure the percentage attendance. So if the member attended all 5 monthly meetings they will have 100%.

<u>Project Meetings</u>: Hopefully your project leaders have been communicating with their members, holding some sort of Zoom type meeting or showing them different types of materials they can access on the computer, such as a video on showmanship, or a cooking show where they learn how to make a dish. All of these will count toward the 6-hours needed for a project completion, if approved by the Project Leader. We are strongly encouraging Project Leaders to seek out any additional resources.

The State 4-H office is re-doing the Record Book Evaluation form for both the club level and the county level judging. Once they are available we will let you know. You will need to figure out a way to collect the member's books – at the same time- practicing all the prescribed procedures for safety. Example: Place a box on your porch for members to drop their books in. Or meet at a central location where members can put their books in a box or basket – while practicing the safe distance protocol. Then when getting the books home, leaving them outside for several days, or sanitize them when taking out of the box. By now you all know how to handle items coming into your home from the outside!

## **County Level Record Book Judging:**

Right now there is not much to tell you about what our County Record Book Judging Process is going to be. Per the committee's request, the 4-H Office contacted the county department that handles the Veterans Hall reservations, and we were able to move 4-H Achievement Night for 2019 -2020 to Friday, 11/13/2020. This will then allow us time as to how, or if we can, host a County Record Book Judging get-together so we could judge the books.

## **Project Update**

**Mounted Level Testing** can completed virtually at home and captured on video. Check in with the Horse Resource Leader first to verify your level and get instructions for uploading your video to google drive.

Written and mounted level tests will be graded and riders notified of their scores via email.

Level pins will be awarded through the mail.

## We're going virtual for **Vision 2020** SLC, July 24-26



## CCFF — PATRICIA WOODLAND MEMORIAL FUND FOR THE ADVANCEMENT OF YOUTH IN POULTRY

**Introduction:** Central Coast Feather Fanciers, a club dedicated to the advancement of poultry breeding and exhibition, has in the month of July 2004 established the Patricia Woodland Memorial Fun for the Advancement of Youth in Poultry, in memory of Pat Woodland, one of the organization's beloved founding members. Through this fund, we wish to continue the generosity that Pat displayed in life by making available designated club funds to promote youth involvement in the poultry fancy.

**Mission Statement:** We, the members of Central Coast Feather Fanciers (CCFF) resolve to use the Patricia Woodland Memorial Fund to promote the advancement of youth involvement in poultry breeding, raising, and exhibition in the Central Coast area of California by supporting San Luis Obispo County youth, both as individuals and though recognized youth organizations, with an emphasis on supporting youth education in tangible ways.

**Purposes:** To provide materials or reimbursement funds for individuals members or project groups to purchase educational materials, equipment, supplies, or birds. Examples of reimbursed purchases would be poultry breed publications, and incubator for project use, a brooder, hatching eggs, chicks, breeding pairs or trios, or funds towards materials for construction of pens or yards.

**Fund Raising:** Central Coast Feather Fanciers (CCFF) would guarantee a minimum total annual contribution of \$300.00, to be distributed to one or more successful applicants. We anticipate that other funds will be contributed by other individuals, families, or poultry organizations.

**Fund Administration:** The money is held by CCFF in a separate account. Funds will be dispersed by the elected Club Treasurer upon approval of a given application by the Selection Committee.

**Eligibility:** Applicant shall be a San Luis Obispo County resident or eligible to show in the California Mid-State Fair (CMSF) and a CCFF youth member in good standing, or a member or a recognized youth organization such as 4-H or FFA, age 18 or younger. Applicants may be age 19 if in high school and a member of 4-H or FFA. Club Chapters of recognized youth organizations may also apply as a group entity.


**Method of Application:** All applications shall be in writing, and prepared using the standard application developed by CCFF. Applications for individuals must include a letter of recommendation from an adult sponsor from a recognized youth organization. The individual or group representative applicant shall describe the specific project request in terms of scope and cost.

**Selection and Award:** Review, selection and approval of applications shall be made by a Selection Committee. The Selection Committee shall present applications being considered at CCFF monthly meetings, for discussion and advisory input form club members. The selection committee will be composed of three club members who regularly attend meetings, and shall include at least one elected club officer.
