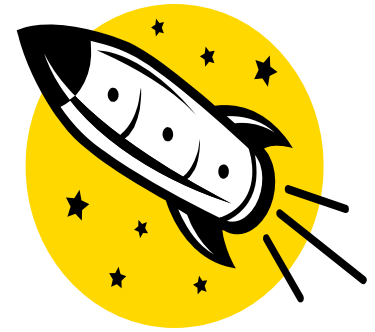

BE A SLO SCIENTIST VOLUNTEER FACILITATOR!

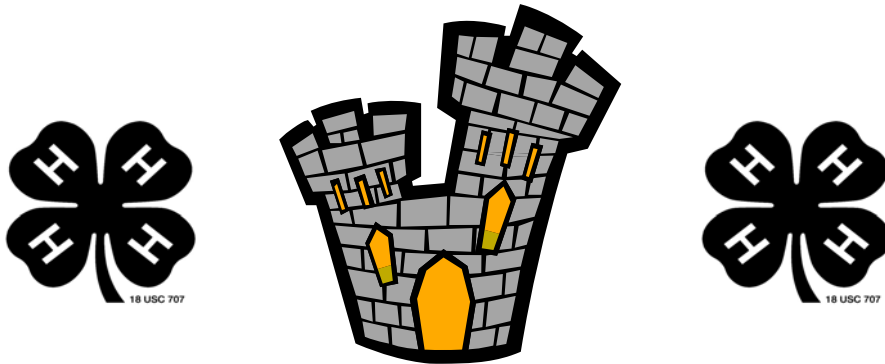
Adults: Would you enjoy leading a group of youth and adults together in fun, hands-on science activities or are you the parent of a teen who would enjoy leading science-related activities together?

Teens: Do you have an interest in science and would enjoy serving as a 4-H junior leader with your parent (or other adult) in a SLO Scientist group?

A TRAINING SESSION for anyone interested in leading a **SLO SCIENTIST Youth/Adult Science Club** will be held on **Wednesday, January 6, 2010, 3:00—5:00 pm** in the **UCCE Auditorium in San Luis Obispo.**

4-H SLO Scientist Youth/Adult Science Clubs are looking for volunteers to help facilitate hands-on science activities for their enthusiastic members. Becoming a 4-H SLO Scientist Volunteer Facilitator is a great way to become involved with kids and parents in the community, and to start a SLO Scientist project within your club. Children, ages 8 to 11, come with a parent or other adult to form a science team; each SLO Scientist group consists of 7 to 10 science teams. SLO Scientist groups meet in various locations around the county, typically 2 evenings a month to explore topics such as earthquakes, soil and water, chemical reactions. You don't need to be an expert in the fields of soils, agriculture or geology since the program emphasizes giving children real experiences to help them learn how to observe, investigate and experiment and just having fun with science experiences! All test questions and answers are taken from the Certified Horsemanship Association's *Certified Horsemanship Manual*, Levels 1-4 and will be the final authority.

Mounted Level Tests will be offered the following Saturday, February 27, 2010 at 10:00 a.m., at the Work Ranch in San Miguel (rain date March 13). To be eligible to participate in mounted level testing, each member must have successfully passed the corresponding written level test. New this year, the day will begin with a brief Mounted Level Testing Clinic presented by the official judge, with testing to follow.

SLO COUNTY 4-H Member returns from NATIONAL HORTICULTURE CONTEST a WINNER!

My name is **Alexis Aguirre** & I would like to share with you the outcome of the National Horticulture contest in Pennsylvania. I had such an incredible and educational experience at the National Junior Horticultural Assn. (NHJA) convention this past October! There were 20 states represented, with over 240 attendees. It was very exciting to meet various delegates from so many states. Twelve states competed in the 4-H Division. California did remarkably well! I cannot put into words the excitement my teammates & I felt at the awards banquet when it was announced that we placed 2nd in this contest! In addition, there was only a 1.6 difference between our team and the 1st place team from Maryland. In individual placings, I placed 6th. In addition, California won 3rd place in the State Display Contest and for the first time, California won the coveted State Team Spirit Award. Including the awards of a few returning California delegates, who competed in an Honors Division, California brought around 14 plaques back home! Needless to say, we had an exceptional team!
