If traveling west on Hwy 46 to Paso Robles, take 24th street west to G-14 (also signed as Nacimiento Lake Dr) to Chimney Rock Road. Follow Chimney Rock to Cypress Mountain Dr. The headquarters entrance is to your right at this intersection off of Chimney Rock Road. Driving distance from Paso Robles is approximately 17 miles.

If traveling Hwy 101 take the Hwy 46 off-ramp west into Paso Robles. Take 24th street west to G-14 (also signed as Nacimiento Lake Dr) to Chimney Rock Road. Follow Chimney Rock Road to Cypress Mountain Dr. The headquarters entrance is to your right at this intersection off of Chimney Rock Road.
