- Completed tree inventory- 3 year project funded by a grant. There are 18,000 street and park trees. Did not include open space trees. ~270 stumps have been located and are recorded as vacant tree sites for future replacements.
- Commemorative trees in Laguna Lake: 291 trees that were purchased by the public for \$300 each (includes the tree, plaque and years of maintenance). The trees have ended up costing the city more than estimated because of the water needs.
