EMERALD STAR

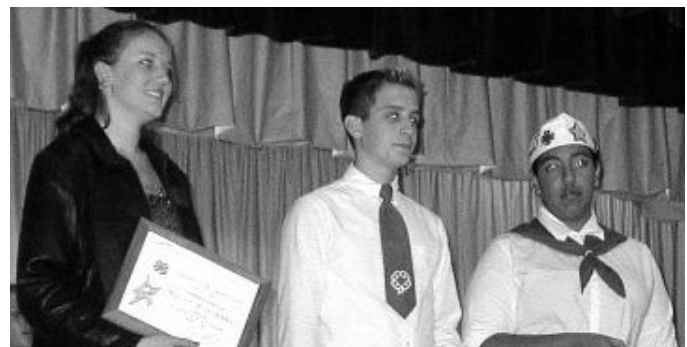

To be eligible, the applicant must have received the Gold Star rank and be 14 years of age or older, present a plan of proposed leadership to be offered on a multi-unit or county basis (or in the community), during the following year. Projects may be planned and completed within a short period of time, or they may take the entire year to complete.

Applications may be obtained from the 4-H Office at any time.

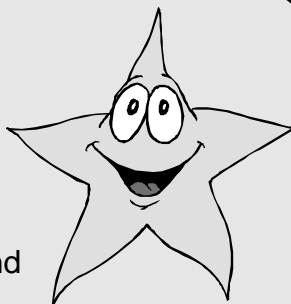
