Maryssa Snow, Ashlyn Snow, Sophie Flemion, John Scrivner, and "Maddie", the Johnson Family's famous Dog.



ALL STAR What It Takes...

The All Star rank is the highest rank which a 4-H member may attain at the county level. Being an All Star provides an opportunity for older members to receive recognition for outstanding service. The All Stars serve as ambassadors for the SLO County 4-H YD Program; they represent 4-H at county, regional, and state activities; they coordinate certain county-wide activities; and they serve as positive role models for youth and adults. To be eligible for the All Star rank, a 4-H member must:

*Be 14 years of age or older by January 1, 2005 but not 19 years of age prior to January 1. *Have been in 4-H for three years or more. *Have attained a Gold Star rank by May 13, 2005. *Demonstrate leadership abilities, citizenship concern, and maturity of judgment?

Each candidate for the All Star rank will be required to submit an All Star application and participate in an individual and group interview. All Star applications may be obtained from the 4-H Office, call 781-5943 or email jgarcia@co.slo.ca.us.


